In order to comply with Government regulations, The Song Room must approve and authorise all community fundraising activities that directly raise money for our organisation. Each application will be assessed to ensure compliance with The Song Room's standards of conduct.

3 STEPS TO RUNNING A SUCCESSFUL FUNDRAISER

Your support will help kids get a better education through music and the arts. They'll enjoy it - and so should you!



Running a fundraiser can be heaps of fun. Here's a step-by-step guide to help you manage your event to get the most out of it!

CHOOSE YOUR ACTIVITY

- Decide what kind of activity or event you and your team would like to hold. Give yourself plenty of time to get organised. If you need advice, just give us a call
- Review this Toolkit and The Song Room's Fundraising Guidelines to ensure you understand your responsibilities as a fundraiser for The Song Room

 Complete the Authority to Fundraise Application and send it through to us by mail

PLAN AND PROMOTE YOUR ACTIVITY

- Enlist others to help with the fundraising. This will really help you extend your network to reach your fundraising goal

 When setting up your fundraising page, make sure you think carefully about the story you want to tell.
 Set yourself and your team an achievable target

- Let people know about your fundraising activity and ask them to support you. Make sure you always include a link to your everydayhero page
- Use your social media networks especially Facebook, Twitter and Instagram. Email your friends, try to reach at least 30. Let your local paper know about your efforts too. Follow us at:

- Make sure your team helps spread the word. Ask your friends to share your everydayhero page with their networks, and ask your employer and local businesses to support you
- Tip: It helps to ask for a specific amount. For example, "Please donate \$50 to enable one child from a refugee background to participate in music and arts programs in their school for 6 months"

BUILD THE MOMENTUM

- Keep the posts coming. Thank people for supporting you. Let your supporters know how you are going with your event preparation. Fun photos and videos are great for keeping people interested in what you're doing
- Share the posts and thank you messages from your everydayhero page to Facebook and Twitter

DONT FORGET...

- Thank your supporters. Use your everydayhero page to let them know how their contributions will help The Song Room. Provide them with photos, certificates, posters, t-shirts, buttons or think of other fun ways to thank them

HOLD A GIG

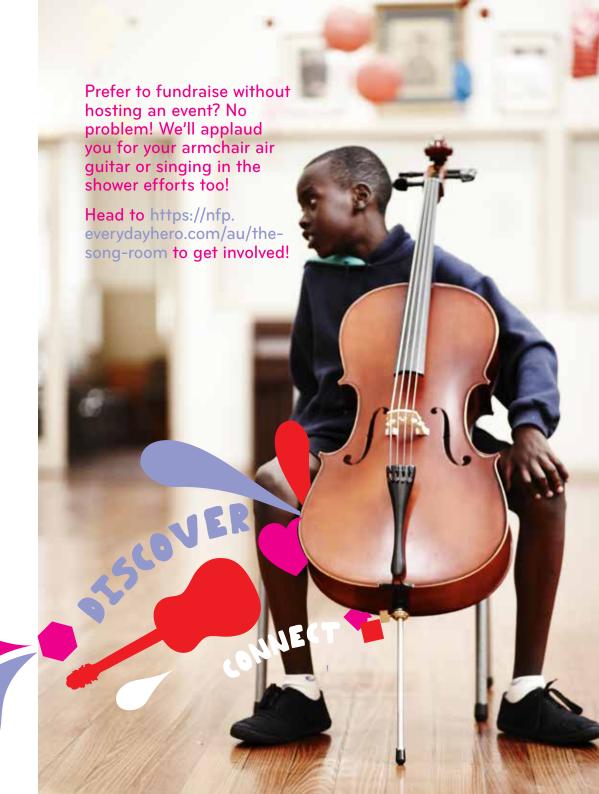
- Support your local music scene and give the benefits of music to disdvantaged children at the same time

HOW YOUR FUNDRAISING WILL HELP



\$20

Provides one class with a range of arts supplies to assist a teacher to engage their students in the arts.



\$150

Helps two sick children and their families to participate in an ongoing music program in a Children's Hospital.



\$1,000

Provides five schools with a set of instruments to keep.



\$50

Provides one class with a set of percussion instruments to keep.



\$250

Provides the materials to create a bi-lingual storybook for parents in culturally diverse communities.



\$5,000

Provides a program for families from refugee backgrounds to find a voice in their new community.



\$80

Enables a disadvantaged child to participate in a six month music and creative arts workshop.



\$500

Helps a school attend their first ever live performance by sponsoring a bus to the venue.



\$15,000

Helps provide a disadvantaged school with a six month workshop for 200 children.



TIPS AND TRICKS

Let's face it, often the hardest part of raising money is the most important part - asking people for donations. Here's three things to keep in mind:

▶ What

Ask for a specific donation amount, say \$50. Often your friends and family just don't know how much to give and sometimes this uncertainty can actually stop them from donating

▶ Why

Tell people why you personally care about The Song Room. Your passion for our cause is contagious. People are far more likely to donate if they understand why our cause is close to your heart

► How

Let people know what will be achieved by The Song Room through your support.

THE FINE PRINT

- All constituent details of the approved fundraising activity are the sole responsibility of the applicant, as set out in the Authority to Fundraise form.
- The organiser must comply with obligations imposed by the Charitable Fundraising Act and applicable State/ Territory laws and regulations.
- All relevant permits and licenses for the activity must be secured by the event organiser.
- Any and all promotional material and collateral produced in conjunction with the proposed fundraising activity must clearly state that this event is 'raising funds for The Song Room', as opposed to a Song Room-managed event.
- Any use of The Song Room logo is to be approved prior to publication by an authorised representative of The Song Room.
- 6. The Song Room alone is authorised to issue a tax-deductable receipt for funds raised and donated to The Song Room. Please note that the Australian Tax Office has ruled that donations are not tax deductable if the donation involves the exchange of money for goods and/or services (such as raffle tickets, competition or event entry tickets).

- Funds raised must be reconciled with The Song Room no later than 10 working days after the event or activity.
- Funds raised and not processed via Everyday Hero can be deposited directly into The Song Room Public Fund bank account, mailed in as a cheque, or donated via the application on our website.
