In partnership with schools, we seek to develop creative, courageous and compassionate young people who take ethical and responsible action, recognise their shared humanity and help shape a better world.

PURPOSE

Song Room Teaching Artists are responsible for planning, developing and implementing high-quality, curriculum-aligned impactful Arts Learning programs in their placement school/s within the program design developed by The Song Room. Teaching Artists will work with students to develop their arts knowledge and skills and with educators to develop their capacity and confidence to embed learning in and through the arts in their professional practice. The Teaching Artist represents The Song Room, adheres to the code of conduct, and builds positive relationships with school leadership and the wider school community to develop a sustainable, positive school culture that embraces Arts Learning.

Teaching Artists are a key agent in achieving The Song Room's vision that all Australian children will have the opportunity to participate in the arts and so enhance their education, personal development and community involvement to provide them with the best possible start in life and is supported with training and development by The Song Room.

The contract role reports to a designated Arts Learning Manager.



OUTCOMES

The following outcomes define the high-level expectations of the role that should be visible and evident:

- The Teaching Artist is an experienced specialist in their art form and a skilled educator who demonstrates a commitment to implementing The Song Room's vision, goals and program logic.
- The Teaching Artist, in collaboration with the placement school, plans and delivers The Song Room program; building confidence, capacity and capability in students and generalist classroom teachers through classroom delivery and the mentoring of participants.
- The Teaching Artists can affect and maintain collaborative working relationships with other Teaching Artists and with professional staff in their placement school to build strong communities of teaching practice.
- The Teaching Artist can affect and maintain positive and collaborative relationships with all members of The Song Room staff. This includes dealing with confidential and sensitive matters, and the escalation of issues.
- The Teaching Artists, in consultation with The Song Room's Arts Learning Team, will assist with professional input into the development and evaluation of learning resources, including ARTS:LIVE, to ensure that these are integrated in school-based Arts Learning and promoted to teachers.
- The Teaching Artist provides timely program documentation, evaluation, analysis, advice, support and reports to the Arts Learning Team.
- Commitment to child safety and The Song Room's Child Safe Policy and Code of Conduct adhered to at all times.

ESSENTIAL CAPABILITIES

The following capabilities define the high-level expectations of the role that should be visible and evident:

Communication	Able to communicate with clarity and impact to facilitate individual and collective understanding, action or information exchange.
Collaboration	Able to work collaboratively with all types of people, contribute to teamwork and to build relationships and networks across a range of people or groups.
Adaptive Mindset	Able to adjust to change and maintain their curiosity while dealing with disruption, pressure and setbacks in a resilient, positive manner.
Problem Solving	Able to define and analyse problems, generate optimal solutions and make recommendations.
Ethics	Able to act with integrity and in conformance with social and professional standards of ethical conduct.



Empathy

Able to recognise and regulate their own emotions in any situation, and is good at identifying and respecting the needs and feelings of other people.

Cultural Awareness

Able to engage with others with sensitivity and regard for diversity and the social or cultural differences affecting behaviour.

EXPERIENCE, QUALIFICATIONS & REGISTRATIONS

- Previous experience in an Arts Learning role in either a Primary or Secondary School context or equivalent experience in a professional arts context
- A minimum of an undergraduate degree in the related art form or equivalent professional or vocational experience
- A qualification in Education, Performing or Visual Arts, or Art/Music therapy or equivalent professional or vocational experience
- Current Working with Children Check (WWCC) or State Teacher Registration. Some programs may also require a Police Check.
- High level written, verbal and presentation communication skills.

CHILD SAFETY

All staff at The Song Room have an obligation to always ensure child safety is paramount and report any concerns they have, in line with our duty of care obligations. You will be required to always have a current working with children check or similar. The Song Room has zero tolerance when it comes to abuse of any kind and will take disciplinary action, including and up to termination of employment, should we determine that abuse has taken place or there has been a failure to report any suspected or alleged abuse.

DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION

At The Song Room, diversity and inclusion are integral to our mission. We believe that our workforce should reflect the rich diversity of the Australian community.
